Annual Dinner, 6 August 2022

We held a very successful Annual Dinner at the Himalayan Kitchen restaurant in North Adelaide, with 21 members and guests enjoying a Nepalese and Tibetan banquet.

This event marked the anniversary of the reformation of the South Australian Branch of the NMBVAA in 2010. It also honoured service and sacrifice during the Malayan Emergency and the Indonesian Confrontation (particularly the fifty Australians from the Malayan wars who still remain buried overseas).

We also honoured our absent comrades and family members.

We remembered Bombardier Brian 'Snowy' Selby who served during Confrontation with 111 Light Anti-Aircraft Battery, Royal Regiment of Australian Artillery and was President of the SA/NT Branch from 2002 to 2006, and again from 2010 until 2022.

We remembered Staff-Sergeant Clive Dubois (2017) of the Arrernte (Arunta) people of Alice Springs, who served at Terendak on the Malay Peninsula, on the Thai-Malay border with the Gurkhas, and with 'C' Company, 3RAR at the forward patrol base at Serikin in Sarawak during Confrontation.

We remembered Wing-Commander Bob Macintosh AFC OAM, Queen's Commendation for Valuable Service in the Air and Mentioned in Despatches, who served during Confrontation in 1965-66, notably flying sorties into the Malayan jungles to deploy Gurkha and Australian patrols.

And we remembered Signaller John Tassell who died on the Malay Peninsula on 4 April 1966, aged 21, who is the only casualty from Confrontation buried in South Australia.

Commemorative place-mats honoured this special occasion. We included the Sabah flag to honour the five Australians who died on operational service in the defence of Sabah, including Lance-Corporal Paul Denehey, Royal Australian Corps of Signals attached to 1 Special Air Service Squadron, who died of wounds after being gored by a rogue elephant on 2 June 1965 during a four-man reconnaissance patrol along the Sabah/Kalimantan border.

Congratulations to the winners of the various raffle prizes. The funds raised through the raffle will go towards our sponsorship of the three Sarawak schools in the Bau district. Thanks also to all who made additional donations, your contributions are all greatly appreciated.

Our Branch Patron, Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson AC, and Mr Rod Bunten were guests of honour at this year's Malaya & Borneo Veterans Day service on Friday 26 August.

We thank the City of West Torrens for the substantial support they provided, No 604 Squadron Australian Air Force Cadets for again providing the armed Catafalque Party and Honour Guard, and Hilton RSL for supporting our reunion and lunch.

We also thank the Royal Australian Navy Band South Australia for their support, and their provision of a Bugler.

For this ceremony we shifted the focus slightly from generic tributes to a more select group of family members honouring specific named personnel.

We thank Her Excellency and Mr Bunten, Mayor Michael Coxon, Mrs Janice Silby, Deputy Commissioner SA for the Department of Veterans' Affairs, and Mr Tony Zappia MP who placed wreaths and tributes in memory of the 71 Australians who died on operational service during the Malayan Emergency and the Indonesian Confrontation with Malaysia, noting that 50 of them remain buried overseas in the soil of our neighbours – and that none of them are buried in an actual war cemetery.

Mrs Beverley Dubois and Clive's daughter Lynette Hunt placed a tribute in memory of former Branch member Clive Dubois.

Mrs Jenny Macintosh OAM placed a tribute in memory of her husband, Wing-Commander Bob Macintosh AFC OAM.







RECENT EVENTS

Monday 15 August, 'Thailand' Pavers Dedication

On VP Day, the Ex-Service Organisation Consortium hosted a ceremony at the Anzac Centenary Memorial Walk on Kintore Avenue at which the two new 'Thailand' pavers were dedicated. Mr Keith Fowler, aged 101, cut the ribbon – 'Chook' Fowler served in North Africa and was taken prisoner-of-war on Java while serving with the 2/3rd Machine-Gun Battalion AIF. He is believed to be the last surviving former prisoner-of-war of the Japanese in South Australia.

The pavers recognise the service and sacrifice of the POWs who worked on the Burma-Thailand Railway during World War 2, as well as RAAF veterans who served at Royal Thai Air Force Base Ubon in northeastern Thailand between 1962 and 1968.

Her Excellency the Governor, the Premier, and Ministers Blair Boyer MP and Geoff Brock MP were among the many VIPs in attendance. Many family members of POWs attended the ceremony, as well as about a dozen RAAF Ubon veterans. Paul Rosenzweig, Don Cameron and Mal White represented the SA/NT Branch, NMBVAA.

Vietnam Veterans' Commemorative Service

Remembering the service and sacrifice of Navy, Army, Air Force, New Zealand and Vietnamese veterans

Sunday 21 August, Vietnam Veterans' Commemorative Service


President Paul Rosenzweig and Vice-President Don Cameron represented the NMBVAA and placed a tribute at this service at the Vietnam War Memorial adjacent to Torrens Parade Ground.

The ceremony was conducted by a group of veteran organisations in partnership with the SA Vietnamese community.

It recognised the service of Australian, New Zealand and Republic of Vietnam Service personnel who fought in the Vietnam War, and particularly the 521 Australians, 37 New Zealanders and as many as 250,000 Service personnel from the Republic of Vietnam who died in the war. Nine Filipinos were also killed in the Vietnam War.



The Vietnam War Memorial includes the name of Corporal Reg Hillier, the only Serviceman from the Northern Territory to lose his life in the Vietnam War.

The Australasian Soldiers Dardanelles Cenotaph, one of the earliest First World War memorials in the country, was unveiled on September 7th, 1915, only 135 days after the landings at Gallipoli on 25 April 1915.

Originally located in the South Park Lands and relocated nearby in 1940, the cenotaph was conceived and designed by Adelaide builder Walter Torode and sponsored by the Wattle Day League.

Designed to commemorate the landing of Australasian troops at Gallipoli, the cenotaph became a place where mothers and relatives of those killed could come to place floral tokens. Its rough design is representative of the rugged cliffs the troops encountered when they landed.

This memorial is recognised for its high level of significance as a State Heritage Place in the South Australian Heritage Register, and is testimony to the support South Australians felt for those fighting overseas and the impact of war on the local community.


Thursday 1 September, DVA Consultative Forum 2022

Sunday 4 September, Dardanelles Cenotaph Commemoration

The Legacy Club of South Australia & Broken Hill and the Australian War Widows (SA) Inc will conduct an Australasian Soldiers Dardanelles Cenotaph Commemorative Service at the Anzac Centenary Memorial Walk in Adelaide on Sunday 4 September.

The Dardanelles Memorial was originally erected in the southwest parklands beside Sir Lewis Cohen Avenue, which became known as 'Wattle Grove'. It was unveiled by the Governor-General Sir Ronald Munro-Ferguson GCMG on Wattle Day, 7 September 1915.

The second school we provide financial assistance to is **SK Serabak** in Serikin – pictured right in August 2019.

In 1965, 'C' Company 3RAR occupied a patrol base at Kampung Serikin, supported by a Fire Support Base established by 29 (Corunna) Light Battery, Royal Artillery.

These fortified rifle company patrol bases had the aim of protecting Kuching by defending the approaches to Bau – “the key to the door of Kuching”.

We honour the eight Australian soldiers who died on operational service in Sarawak in 1965-66, and the three who died after being evacuated from Sarawak.

Sarawak

One key aspect of our approach to commemoration is to ‘Remember Malaysia’. The SA/NT Branch provides ongoing financial assistance to three adopted schools [*Sekolah Kebangsaan, SK*] in the Bau District of Sarawak.

One of these schools is **SK Suba Buan** – pictured left during our most recent visit in August 2019.

We have again collected a donation for each of the three schools, which our good friend the Honorary Australian Consul in Kuching Datuk Phillip Ting AM has very generously added to, and we are currently making arrangements to pass on to the schools.



We also support **SK Stass** – the image to the left is from our visit to Kampung Stass in August 2019.

Between March and June 1965, 'A' Company 3RAR occupied a patrol base near Kampung Stass, supported by a Fire Support Base established by 29 (Corunna) Light Battery, Royal Artillery. 'D' Company 3RAR was based at Stass during June and July 1965.

Between April and September 1966, 'B' Company 4RAR occupied the Stass company patrol base, supported by 'V' Battery, 6 Light Regiment Battery, Royal Artillery.

SARAWAK DEFENDERS HISTORICAL TRAIL

We have also made a commitment to support the creation of a ‘Sarawak Defenders Historical Trail’ in the Bau district of Kuching. This is being developed by the Sarawak Tourism Federation as a series of key sites near the Sarawak-Kalimantan border where Australian force elements established defensive positions in 1965-66.

The first site being developed is a memorial park in Kampung Gumbang (see right), and we have made a contribution towards the cost of creating this proposed site. More to follow in future newsletters.





Malaysian Evening in Tawa

It is a source of pride to us that our NMBVAA Confrontation memorial plaque and the New Zealand Malayan Veterans Association plaque sit beside each other in the Sarawak Heroes Memorial Park in Kuching – our Branch plaque was unveiled and dedicated on 29 August 2016, and the New Zealand MVA plaque on 29 August 2017.

Our Branch President Paul Rosenzweig took the opportunity while in New Zealand recently to attend a fund-raising 'Malaysian Evening' hosted by the MVA and the NZ Malaysian Society.

The guest of honour was the Malaysian High Commissioner to New Zealand, Her Excellency Nur Izzah Wong Mee Choo – it was Her Excellency's birthday so she was surprised with a special cake.

Apart from an enjoyable night in good company with excellent makan, it was an opportunity to consolidate plans for the combined reunion visit to Sarawak and Service of Commemoration in August 2023.





For the raffle Bill donated a framed print of 'Kampong New Zealand', and Paul donated a bottle of Hardy's Stamp of Australia Shiraz Cabernet.

The event went well – the keg of Iban Princess beer was all sold and the two raffles brought in \$450.

Among the highlights of the night was a display of New Zealand memorabilia from the Confrontation era.

A monitor displayed the video footage of the combined Australia-New Zealand commemorative ceremony which we held in the Sarawak Heroes Memorial Park in Kuching in August 2019.

Lest we Forget

Auckland War Memorial Museum

The Auckland War Memorial Museum Tāmaki Paenga Hira, the consecrated Court of Honour and the Auckland Cenotaph are special places of remembrance for families and returned Service personnel who want to honour their loved ones and fallen comrades.

The Museum and Cenotaph were officially opened on 28 November 1929, and an Anzac Day ceremony was first held at the Cenotaph on 25 April 1930.

The AWMM includes a special War Memorial Gallery, which includes the Rolls of Honour for all wars and campaigns New Zealand has been involved in – including the Malayan Emergency (1948-1960) and the Indonesian Confrontation with Malaysia (1962-1966).

In Adelaide, a Vietnam Veterans' Commemorative Service was conducted on Sunday 21 August by a group of veteran organisations in partnership with the SA Vietnamese community. This ceremony also recognised the 37 New Zealanders who died in the Vietnam War. These 37 names are also listed in the War Memorial Gallery of the Auckland War Memorial Museum Tāmaki Paenga Hira.

The Gallery also includes rolls of the fallen from contemporary operations including five who died on operations in East Timor. These include soldiers such as Private Leonard Manning who was shot dead by militiamen near the West Timor border on 24 July 2000.

In addition, two New Zealand civilians were killed in Timor – one a member of the 'Balibo five' journalists (1975) and one a student caught in the Santa Cruz massacre (1991).
