## BRANCH UPDATES

On 1 September, Vice-President Don Cameron attended the 2022 SA Deputy Commissioner's Consultative Forum hosted by Mrs Janice Silby, Assistant Secretary Income Support Branch and Deputy Commissioner SA.

Planning is proceeding for the 2023 combined Australia-New Zealand service of commemoration in the Sarawak Heroes Memorial Park in Kuching to mark the 63<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of the end of the Malayan Emergency and the 57<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of the Indonesian Confrontation with Malaysia.

Paul and Crisel Rosenzweig and Don and Jenny Cameron made a private trip to Kuching in September, as a reconnaissance and liaison visit on behalf of the Branch, to discuss plans and options for this reunion.

Arrangements were kindly made by Fiona Marcus Raja (Chair of the Heritage Development Committee, Sarawak Tourism Federation). Generous support was given by Datuk Dr Philip Ting AM PGBK (Australian Honorary Consul).

The recon party was received at various functions, starting with a welcoming reception hosted by Lieutenant-General Datuk Steven Mundaw (ret'd) and members of the Sarawak Veterans' Association.

They planted a Norfolk Island Pine in the Heroes Memorial Park in memory of Brian Selby, and honoured the anniversary of the liberation of Batu Lintang POW Camp and Brigadier Tom Eastick DSO, Commander Kuching Force.

They travelled to Sekolah Kebangsaan Serabak in the Bau District to hand over the Branch donations and Certificates of Affiliation to our three adopted schools – SK Serabak, SK Suba Buan and SK Stass.

The party also met with YB Datuk Sebastian Ting, Deputy Minister for Tourism Sarawak, and presented him with the Branch donation to go towards the development of a memorial park in Kampung Gumbang, the first in a series of sites which will comprise the Sarawak Defenders Heritage Trail.

## Sarawak Heroes Memorial Park

Friday 9 September

A special service and tree-planting ceremony was held in the Sarawak Heroes Memorial Park in Kuching in memory of Brian 'Snowy' Selby (1945-2022). It was arranged by the Sarawak Heritage Development Committee, and was supported by the City Council of North Kuching (DBKU).

Paul and Don planted a Norfolk Island Pine, and then placed a wreath, kindly provided by the Sarawak Tourism Federation. Jenny Cameron placed a tribute on behalf of Christine Selby, and Don placed a tribute in memory of the Iban Trackers who had supported the Australian and Commonwealth forces during the Malayan Wars.

This was followed by the placing of personal floral tributes by those in attendance. Don recited the Ode of Remembrance, and Paul acknowledged with sadness the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, Queen of Australia and Head of the Commonwealth.

## Batu Lintang Liberation

Sunday 11 September

In Kuching on Sunday 11 September, our executive party marked the anniversary of the liberation of Batu Lintang POW Camp at the *Institut Pendidikan Guru Kampus Batu Lintang* (IPGK) – a teachers' training college which has stood on the site of the wartime Batu Lintang POW Camp since July 1948.

The service was held in the impressive IPGK Batu Lintang Historical Museum (*Muzium Sejarah IPGK Batu Lintang*). The ceremony was arranged by the Sarawak Heritage Development Committee of the Sarawak Tourism Federation.

After the service, a wreath-laying ceremony was held at the adjacent Batu Lintang Memorial Square and Memorial. Paul and Datuk Wee Hong Seng, Mayor of Kuching South, placed a wreath, kindly provided by the Sarawak Tourism Federation.

Don recited the Ode of Remembrance, and Paul acknowledged the accession of His Majesty King Charles III, by the Grace of God King of Australia and Head of the Commonwealth.

## Sekolah Kebangsaan donations

Our approach to commemoration includes the aims to 'Remember Malaysia' and to 'Look to the future'.

We provide ongoing financial assistance to three adopted schools [Sekolah Kebangsaan] in the Bau District of Sarawak, near the Sarawak-Kalimantan border where Australian force elements established defensive positions in 1965 and 1966.

On Tuesday 13 September, our recon party visited SK Serabak school in Serikin where a ceremony was hosted by Ms Magdalena anak Joseph Nyadi.

We presented our donation for **SK Suba Buan** and a Certificate of Affiliation to Mr Teo Soon Kiun, Science Teacher (right: centre of image).

Joining us were Fiona Marcus, Chair of the Sarawak Heritage Development Committee, Sarawak Tourism Federation, who made the arrangements for our visit, and Datuk Philip Ting AM PGBK, Australian Honorary Consul to Sarawak, who added to each of our donations.



We presented our financial donation for **SK Stass** and a Certificate of Affiliation to Ms Jacelyn Nihar, English Teacher (left: centre of image).

From March to June 1965, 'A' Company 3RAR occupied a fortified company patrol base at Kampung Stass where the school is today. During June and July 1965, 'D' Company 3RAR was based here. Then 'B' Company 4RAR occupied the Stass patrol base between April and September 1966.

We presented our financial donation for **SK Serabak** and a Certificate of Affiliation to Mr Lipeng Nyogen, English Teacher (right: centre of image).

The SK Serabak school in Serikin was built on the site where 'C' Company 3RAR had occupied a fortified rifle company patrol base from March to July 1965. These bases had the aim of protecting Kuching by defending the approaches to Bau – "the key to the door of Kuching".





## Kampung Gumbang

We have also made a commitment to support the creation of a 'Sarawak Defenders Historical Trail' in the Bau district of Sarawak.

This is being developed by the Sarawak Tourism Federation as a series of key sites near the Sarawak-Kalimantan border where Australian force elements established defensive positions in 1965-66.

The first proposed site is a park in Kampung Gumbang, to be established beneath giant boulders which marked the path to the Australian position.



Don Cameron served on Borneo in 1965 during the Indonesian Confrontation with Malaysia, with 6 Platoon, 'B' Company of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment.

'B' Company 3RAR occupied a forward defensive position near the Sarawak-Kalimantan border adjacent to Kampung Gumbang.

When Don was serving at Bukit Knuckle in 1965 with 'B' Company 3RAR, the local store owner in Kampung Gumbang was Mr Chin Kim Chong.

Don met Mr Chin again in 2014. Members of the visits in 2016 and 2019 may recall meeting with him and his family. Sadly, Mr Chin passed away last year.

During this visit to Kampung Gumbang, Don and Jenny met up with Mr Chin's son and presented him with a 3RAR polo shirt.



On Tuesday 13 September, our recon party met with Yang Berhormat Datuk Sebastian Ting, the Sarawak Deputy Minister for Tourism.



## 'Mostly Unsung' supports the NMBVAA





## MALAYAN VETERANS DAY 2022 – NEW ZEALAND

On Friday 16 September, members of the New Zealand Malayan Veterans Association and whānau [extended family] were welcomed at the Pukeahu National War Memorial Park in Wellington to commemorate the New Zealand servicemen involved in military operations in Malaya/Malaysia.

The High Commissioner of Malaysia to New Zealand, Her Excellency Nur Izzah Wong Mee Choo (centre of photo below) was in attendance.

Ray was the 'Parade RSM' who marched in the New Zealand MVA Contingent for the combined commemoration service in the Sarawak Heroes Memorial Park in Kuching in August 2019.

Bill is Vice-President of the MVA and was contingent commander for the visit to Kuching in 2019.



## Waipoua National Army Museum

Halfway down the North Island of New Zealand between Auckland and Wellington, on State Highway One on the North Island Volcanic Plateau, is the small town of Waipoua.

A key feature here is the National Army Museum Te Mata Toa. The museum opened in 1978, and features many static displays of New Zealand's military heritage.

Waipoua is the perfect site for such an outstanding museum: it is a military town, with the New Zealand Army Camp and the Training Group which is responsible for the training of recruits and other soldiers. The Royal NZ Navy's Irirangi communications station with its huge antennae is 2 km north of Waipoua.

The Royal New Zealand Air Force uses Waipoua Airfield for practice landings of C-130 Hercules aircraft, and Jameson Field for NH-90 and A-109 helicopters.

New Zealand deployed an infantry battalion and SAS troops to assist the British in putting down the rebels during the Malayan Emergency.

Then during the insurgency known as 'Confrontation', New Zealand again contributed infantry and SAS troops. After Confrontation ended in 1966, New Zealand stationed an infantry battalion, first in Malaysia and afterwards in Singapore. This battalion came home in 1989.

## Tracking

The soldiers in this diorama are deep in a dense Malayan jungle, searching for an enemy that often proved elusive.

The New Zealand troops used tracking teams who became skilled in the small signs that could mean nearby enemy soldiers. First they had to learn how the jungle looked in its natural state in order to spot anything that might be out of the ordinary. Broken branches, squashed sticks, or skid marks might be a give-away that someone was close, or a broken spider web might indicate the route taken by a hunted man.

The scouts who led patrols required nerves of steel and had to be constantly alert to signs of enemy activity, or the possibility of an ambush lurking in the jungle shadows.

The second man in this patrol is an Iban tracker – a local Malayan helping the Kiwis fighting in the jungle. The indigenous Ibans became an integral part of the platoons they were attached to, since they were expert trackers and had terrific navigation skills.
