55TH ANNIVERSARY NOTES

We are approaching the end of the 2021 calendar year which is a milestone year for all veterans of the Indonesian Confrontation war with Malaysia. Our long planned visit to the Australian War Memorial in Canberra for the 55th anniversary of the Cease Fire and signing of the Peace Agreement by Malaysia and Indonesia had to be cancelled two weeks before the commemoration tour because of the COVID-19 spread into the ACT. Despite this, the daily *Last Post* ceremony at the AWM on 11 August was dedicated to the anniversary; the address by the Director, Mr Matt Anderson PSM, was well received and the podcast of the ceremony was accessed by our colleagues in KL and Sarawak.

Locally, to mark the anniversary, a two page, in depth article written by journo Andrew Fawlkner was printed on Friday, 12th of August in the *Adelaide Advertiser*.

Although we were curtailed by the COVID-19 restrictions in Adelaide, the SA & NT commemoration service was held on Friday, 27 August in the City of West Torrens War Memorial Gardens at Hilton and a larger than expected turnout by veterans and guests was very pleasing. Thank you to the City of West Torrens for providing the PA system, the seating and housekeeping.

The commemoration address was made by MAJ Paul Rosenzweig [Ret] OAM JP and the Response by our Branch Padre, MAJ Quentin Castle.

After the Service, lunch and hospitality were hosted by Hilton RSL and again, Thank you to Hilton RSL President Ian Gardner and the volunteers for providing the venue and spread for the members and visitors who joined us.

MALAYSIA ACT 1963



An Act to make provision for and in connection with the federation of North Borneo, Sarawak and Singapore with the existing States of the Federation of Malaysia. (31st July 1963)

BE it enacted by the Queen's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

Chapter 35....
Arrangement of Sections

1. MALAYSIA.
2. Consequences of the modification of British Nationality Acts.
3. Operation of Existing Law.
4. Power to make consequential provisions.
5. Judicial arrangements.
6. Short title and repeals.

Schedules:

Schedule 1 - exemptions from operations S.2(2) of act.
Schedule 2 - Provisions referred to in S.3 (2) of act.
Schedule 3 - Repeals.

TPI NEWS

The **TPI Constitution** is in need of revision to include changes made to the MRCA, DRCA, SRCA etc which have moved the goalposts substantially regarding veterans who may have 100% disabilities, but, are ineligible for TPI membership.

Confirmation has been received that the training of Welfare Officers, [NOT Pensions Officers], will revert to the responsibility of DVA., which is how it was under the TIP program and should never have been removed from DVA. For anyone but DVA to oversee training is ridiculous. The bureaucracy created by ATDP [public servants] achieved very little in the way of training but became good at creating self promotion, cliques, meeting schedules and acronyms to confuse everyone. Many long standing Welfare Officers were disenfranchised and left.....

MAYBE we can now get back to DVA again providing "Refresher Courses" to ensure that Welfare Officers are aware of current procedures, but not insisting the WO's continue training up to legal knowledge of compensation?

Who knows, we may even see "Open Arms" get back to calling itself "Veterans' Counselling Service".....

DVA UPDATES

Contrary to some misinformation circulating, DVA is NOT contemplating any reductions, or cessation of Veterans' Home Care services. In the 2020/21 period, 36,000 clients were assisted with care and home maintenance.....

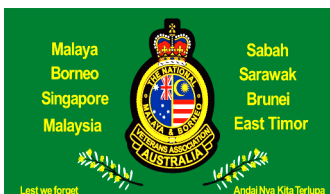
